This is the last issue of the Oryx for 2017-2018. Once again, this has been an eventful year. We have been busy and you will have been updated with all the news through the year. Now it is time to say goodbye to some and wish them all the best on the next passage of their journey. And we wish all our returning families safe travels if they are travelling but mostly a peaceful and relaxing time and hope that you have time to spend with each other.

Here is a reminder of a few practical matters for the end of year:

- School finishes for students on Wednesday, 20th June at 11:30.
- On the last day of school, students have to return their books and have their exit slips signed. Please do not drop off books at the office, we do not know which books a student has to return. Students have to go to their different teachers to return their books in the condition they received it



in and have the exit slip signed by the subject teachers. The exit slips are then returned to the homeroom teacher at the end of the day. Books that are not in an acceptable condition, will have to be paid for so that they can be replaced.

- In the last week of June, students in Years 8, 9, 10 and 12 receive a final June Transcript with their grades for Semester 1, Semester 2 and the examination grade.
 - Please note that no transcripts will be sent to families where either the exit slip has not been completed and submitted or where there are outstanding monies owed to the school.
- School starts for the new academic year on Monday, 13th August 2018 at the normal time.
 - For new families, there will be an Introduction Coffee Morning on 10th August.

I will be attending the Summer Institute from the College Board at the New York University made possible in part by the Office of Overseas Schools during next week. This will be an excellent opportunity for me to familiarise myself more with the application process in the US and to meet university admissions officers from the US.

And on the topic of university applications - SATs/ACTs

Standardised tests (the SATs and ACTs) have for long been a requirement for students to sit if they want to apply to study in the USA. These have been controversial in some ways, because some students get an advantage because they practise these long before they write the actual tests. In some cases, parents pay consultants to "train" their children to get the edge when writing the test and therefore have a better chance of getting admitted, especially to universities that are highly competitive.

Now the University of Chicago is no longer requiring SAT or ACT scores for their university application. Although many colleges had already dropped this requirement, this is remarkable, since the University of Chicago is one of the top research universities in the US. Out of over 27 500 applications the university received for the September 2017 intake, just over 2 400 applicants were admitted. If you would like to read the full article please: Click here

Celebrating Life!


